## Fair Trade helps farmers and people who eat.

We have a fair-trade sales table - Coffee, Tea and Chocolate.

- Fair trade means that the growers and producers sell their products to a distributor who wants to help the growers instead of exploiting them.
- Fair trade often means that farmers can afford both food and school for their children.
- Fair trade means the farmers can decide how to care for the land they know and love instead of complying with dictates from multinational corporations.
- Fair trade means that you can buy high quality food at attainable prices. Especially when you get coffee, tea or chocolate through your congregation.

Equal Exchange started with an idea: What if food could be traded in a way that is honest and fair, a way that empowers both farmers and consumers? Our founders - Rink Dickinson, Jonathan Rosenthal and Michael Rozyne - asked this question as they envisioned a trade model that values each part of the supply chain. They decided to take a big risk and started importing fairly traded coffee from Nicaragua in 1986, despite a US embargo against the Sandinista government. A new business was born from this bold act of solidarity with Latin American farmers and Equal Exchange grew from there.

#### Chocolate sales special

Chocolate prices have gone up worldwide. But at Emmanuel we have chocolate bars from last season. To make room for new and fresh chocolate bars, there are discount prices right now. Last year's price for fair trade, organic Equal Exchange 2.8 oz. chocolate bars was \$2.75.
