This is a two-week mailing. Hold onto your bulletin for Sunday, August 25.

Church Picnic this Sunday!! After worship in the fellowship hall, stay for a meal together.

I am fascinated with the description of Wisdom as a woman who invites everyone to a meal. In Proverbs, Wisdom invites the simple to learn God's ways. Wisdom is old, as old as creation. In Proverbs 8, wisdom is part of the work of creating everything. John 1 echoes Proverbs 8 and Genesis 1. Jesus, the word of God who is God, is at creation. *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. All things came into being with him.*

In Greek, wisdom is called Sophia. You may have heard of churches called Holy Wisdom or Hagia Sophia. I can remember seeing this name on a church building while driving on Route 376 through the North Side. The St. Boniface Roman Catholic building had a large sign for their parish name: Holy Wisdom. There is a very impressive building in Constantinople also called Hagia Sophia. It was built as the cathedral. It is now a mosque, but the name has remained Hagia Sophia.

Between the writing of Proverbs and the birth of Jesus, religious writing continued to describe God's Wisdom as a woman. In the Wisdom of Solomon, in the Apocrypha, the writer says:

There is in Wisdom a spirit that is intelligent, holy, unique, manifold, subtle, mobile, clear, unpolluted, distinct, invulnerable, loving the good, keen, irresistible, beneficent, humane, steadfast, sure, free from anxiety, all-powerful, overseeing all, and penetrating through all spirits that are intelligent, pure, and altogether subtle. For Wisdom is a breath of the power of God, and a pure emanation of the glory of the Almighty. She is a reflection of eternal light, a spotless mirror of the working of God, and an image of his goodness. She reaches mightily from one end of the earth to the other, and she orders all things well. -Wisdom of Solomon 7:22-26; 8:1
