Lenten Offering to Develop Housing

Special Lenten offering envelopes for Bethel AME are included in this week's mailing.

There are 36 affordable and available rental homes for every 100 extremely low-income renter households in Allegheny County. While Bethel AME and their allies worked to receive land back from the Penguins and the city, the goal was always to restore and renew the local community, especially to build low-income rental housing. Grants and public funding will not cover the cost of building. And it

takes money to prepare all the information necessary to apply for loans and grants.

The Emmanuel council has affirmed this as our special Lenten offering. Every year the Emmanuel council designates 10% of the income from the tallest cell tower for benevolent causes which are not in the regular budget. At the last council meeting, \$200 was allocated for our synod's collection for the Bethel AME affordable housing endeavors.



Governments have some similarities to businesses. Governments take in revenues, mostly from taxes and services, e.g., income tax and stamps to mail a letter. Like businesses, governments have expenses too, e.g., salaries, property maintenance, leases, etc.

The products of good government are the protection of its citizens and residents, peace with justice and the common good. God has assigned this role to government. Among ourselves, we disagree as to how far this protection extends, and which units of government provides what protection. Hence, we have political parties, politicians and civil servants. **With some semblance of a business, our various units of government are not businesses.**

Churches, likewise, have some similarities to businesses. The major source of revenue for churches is from the contributions of its members. Like businesses, churches have expenses too, e.g., salaries, property maintenance, etc., plus missionary work beyond its memberships. The product churches offer is the many manifestations of the gospel of Jesus Christ through their members. Churches are to provide charity and be advocates for justice. **With some semblance of a business, churches are not businesses.**
